You will be watching the video, *A Midwife's Tale,* which focuses on women's roles in the late 1700s/early 1800s. As you watch the video, you will notice that the women's lives then are very different from the lives of women living today. Take notes on how the women deal with

- 1. medical care
- 2. weddings/marriage
- 3. housework
- 4. pregnancy/birth

After watching the video you will write a paper that compares and contrasts women's lives then and now when it comes to medical care, marriage, housework, and pregnancy.

- <u>Title</u>: create a title for your paper that reflects the topic.
- Paragraph 1- Thesis: This is where you will introduce the topic and information that will be included in the rest of your paper.
- Paragraphs 2, 3, 4- Body: In these paragraphs you will **compare and contrast** three (3) of the 4 aspects: medical care, marriage, housework, and pregnancy. One paragraph per topic and you can pick the order of your aspect paragraphs.
- <u>Paragraph 5- Conclusion</u>: This is your conclusion paragraph. You will summarize the body of the essay here.

Please type your paper. 12 point font, double-spaced, standard margins.

This paper is worth 60 points. Each paragraph is worth 10 points & grammar is 10 points.
