The purpose of the NHD project is for you to learn about a historical topic related to the theme and draw conclusions about the significance of your topic and its connection to the theme. You will conduct primary and secondary research and then analyze & interpret your research. Your findings will be presented though one of the categories formats listed below.

Detailed directions are on Ms. Day's website, msjday.weebly.com, and nhd.org

- **1. Topic:** Pick "narrow" history topic (> 20 years old) that relates to the theme: "**Triumph and Tragedy in History**." (**Examples-** Narrow: "Winter Camp at Valley Forge", Too Broad: The American Revolution.)
- 2. Research & Bibliography:
 - A. Research: Use at least 10 different sources with at least 5 Primary sources.
 - Start with the resources listed on your history class's website.
 - B. Annotated Bibliography: Use MLA format. www.bibme.org
 - Annotations: 1. It identifies what type of source this is (song, poem, book, website, journal article, diary entry, newspaper article, etc.)
 - 2. What information did you find in the source?
 - 3. How did the source help you understand your topic and create your project?
 - ***Remember: Give credit to your sources, otherwise you are plagiarizing. Don't be a thief! ***
- **3. Thesis (Claim) Statement:** Approximately one paragraph that introduces the topic and its significance (the point that you are trying to prove.) The rest of the presentation includes supporting evidence that backs up your thesis.

A good thesis statement:

- Addresses a narrow topic
- Explains the historical significance of the topic (Why is this important?)
- Clearly connects the topic to the NHD theme "Triumph and Tragedy in History."
- Should be located in an obvious place in your final presentation.
- **4. Presentation:** Your final presentation (project) will display your thesis, overview of topic, significance/impact and theme relationship in a neat, creative, and accurate manner. Examples and specific directions & rules for each category are listed on the NHD website.

C. Performance (play) individual or group up to 5 people
